Silent Reading: You will be required to read at least <u>TWO</u> books, outside of the classroom selections, on your own. Most Fridays will be dedicated to silent reading. You need to select a <u>grade level</u> <u>appropriate NOVEL</u> that will be read independently. The first novel will need to be completed before the end of the first semester (end of the second marking period). The second novel will need to be completed before the end of second semester (end of the fourth marking period). There will be a culminating activity (written response) for each novel that you will need to complete.

These are done around the fourth week of each marking period. These count as a grade.
