In the Lancaster playoff game, he had 2 interceptions which ultimately lead to touchdowns. In the championship game against New Rochelle Darrik had 5 receptions for 53 yards, 2 rushes for 26 yards. He also made the play that will forever be etched in NT history as he out jumped the DB for the decisive TD on a halfback pass (3rd and goal) from Joe Montesanti. 

Bloomfield caps MVP performance by catching game-winning touchdown

SYRACUSE — The North Tona-wanda foetball team ended a perfect season as state champions, and, as has been the case all season, the list of contributors is a very long one

One player literally jumped to the top of that list Sunday afternoon.
