Classroom Policies

Classroom Guidelines and Expectations:

- Be RESPECTFUL, be ON TIME, and be PREPARED
- As you enter the room, pick up your daily notes, have a seat and begin the warm-up on the board. Take out your homework assignment from the night before.
- Have all necessary materials for class every day.
- Treat others the way you want to be treated.
- Take responsibility for yourself and your learning.

- Progress reports will be given to every student at the 5 and 10-week mark of each marking period. These progress reports will be a 20-point quiz grade. (5 additional bonus points will be provided upon parent/guardian comments regarding student progress).
- Up-to-date grades will be available weekly on e-school. Students without access may receive their grade at the end of class.

Extra Help:

- If you do not understand something that is covered in class, **please ask questions**! If you still do not understand the material after asking questions and seeking help during the given class time, you can arrange a time to me outside of class for extra help.
- I am more than willing to meet with you before or after school by appointment. I arrive at school betwen 7:00am and 7:15am every morning. I will take into consideration those students who sought extra help consistently when computing averages.
