#### Tab # 1 ~ The Writing Process:

## Tab # 2 ~ Interpreting the Task:

- Read the task twice.
- Circle, highlight or <u>underline</u> the requirements of the task. Include key words or phrases.
- Can you "echo back" words from the required task?
- Make connections between the text and the task.
- Decide what information will be placed on the Graphic Organizer  $\rightarrow$  Tab 6

# Tab # 3 ~ The Introduction

The first paragraph of an extended response

- Hook grabs the reader's attention and helps the reader focus on the task.
  It may be a question, a statement, a definition, a quotation, or a description.
- Link connects the hook and the thesis to the topic of the extended response. It includes the author, title, and genre of the passage if appropriate.
- Thesis It is the main idea or main point of the extended response. It's the hypothesis → what is going to be proven.



## Tab # 4 ~ Body Paragraphs

- There may be 2-3 body paragraphs  $\rightarrow$  look at the task! What is it asking?
- First sentence → Topic Sentence tells the main idea of the paragraph. Explain it!
- Text-Based Details → Use 3 5 text-based details, details, details to support the thesis → main idea. Explain them!
- Closing Sentence ~ It sums up the main idea of the paragraph. It leads to the next paragraph.
- Use transitions effectively!

### Tab # 5 ~ Conclusion Paragraph

- Restate the Thesis Brings the reader back to the focus of the extended response essay. It restates the thesis (main idea) in a different form than the introduction.
- Final Thought What Conclusion was drawn? It leaves the reader thinking  $\rightarrow$  it's the point to ponder...
  - It should not be a question!
- Use a concluding transition effectively!
