About the First Grade Team...

Miss Byrne has taught kindergarten, first, second, fourth and fifth grades in the North Tonawanda City School District (previously at Ohio, Meadow, and Gilmore). Every grade level has been fun for her to teach, but she truly loves teaching first grade because she believes that the students grow so much throughout the year. Miss Byrne holds professional certification in childhood education and has master's degrees in literacy and special education. Outside of the classroom, Miss Byrne enjoys doing yoga, barre classes, going on bike rides, going for walks, drinking coffee, reading books, and spending time with her family.

Mrs. Lipps has taught first, second, and third grades in the North Tonawanda City School District at Ohio, Meadow, and Drake. She holds professional teaching certificates in childhood education and early childhood education and has a master's degree in literacy. Outside of the classroom, Mrs. Lipps enjoys singing and songwriting with her husband, Timothy.

Ms. Moore has been teaching since 1980 and has been at Drake School since 1989. She has taught kindergarten through fifth grade and first grade is her absolute favorite grade to teach. Ms. Moore will be the special education teacher for first grade.

Morning Meeting

I merculate allowing and historia students will participate in a unifying group activity. Morning meeting sets the tone for learning and helps to establish a climate of trust and respect.

Math

Math topics this year include addition, subtraction, five and ten relationships, patterns on a hundreds board, comparing and ordering numbers to 100, measurement, time to the half-hour, graphs, geometry, and fractions. Students will participate in whole group discussions, small group lessons, partner games, technology centers, and hands-on math stations to learn material and work on fact fluency.

Reading

Our reading workshop will open with a strategy mini-lesson on comprehension, fluency, or word-solving and then will incorporate time for independent literacy activities and small group reading lessons with the teacher. Students will also be exposed to a variety of texts through interactive read alouds and shared reading experiences. By the end of first grade, students typically move up several reading levels.

Writing

Through the use of mentor texts, teacher modeling and guided writing, students will be completing narrative, how-to, informational, poetry, and opinion writing pieces this year. Students will be taught the process of planning, drafting, editing, revising, and composing final copies and will have frequent one-to-one writing conferences with the teacher.

Word Study

Word study is an alternative to traditional spelling instruction based on recognizing word patterns rather than memorizing unconnected words. Students will be instructed in differentiated groups based on their developmental spelling levels through the use of word sorts. Students will also learn common sight words to aid them in their reading.

Social Studies and Science

Students will receive instruction in social studies or science four days a week. Science lessons will be centered around inquiry about the earth, weather, matter, energy, and living things. Major themes in the social studies curriculum for first grade are citizenship, families, our community, and wants/needs.
