1. WELCOME TO INTRODUCTION TO HORTICULTURE

This College Acceleration Program (CAP) course is being offered as an opportunity to earn three college credits through Niagara County Community College (NCCC), along with North Tonawanda High School credit. Your college credits may be used directly at NCCC or can be transferred to any other SUNY college and most private colleges. You will need to earn a "C" grade or better to transfer college credits (please see the NCCC CAP Student Handbook for complete detail).
